The 6-mile walk took place at Chatsworth Estate, where Maddison was joined by her family in support of her grandad.










Message from Health and Safety Officer and Site Manger

As the leader of a team who's responsibilities include maintaining and improving the school site there is more and more emphasis being placed on sustainability and the environmental impact with every decision we make. Whether it be a repair job or a large project there are several questions we need to ask ourselves. How are the materials sourced? What is the impact on our carbon footprint? Will we have redundant parts to dispose of and, environmentally, how best can we do this? Will the system be more efficient going forward?

One of our more recent, and successful, larger projects has been the conversion from lamp to LED floodlighting on our astroturf pitch. This is a massively used facility, particularly after school hours by lots of local groups and clubs so we highlighted this as an area where we could make a huge impact on both our decarbonisation drive and improve the facilities for our users. After extensive research, we decided to use a local, but world-leading company, so Abacus Lighting was contracted to carry out this project. During the school holidays in the summer of 2023, the project was undertaken and I hope you will agree the end result has been well worth the investment. From an environmental perspective, the new lights have given us an immediate reduction of 45% in Kilowatt hours (Kwh) used and it has been calculated at our current usage levels a financial return within four years will be achieved.









Sustainability Activities We Have Participated In...

- ·All students attended an assembly about being more sustainable during the festive season
- ·Students in Y9 and Y10 have green careers sessions to work through during their tutor time careers slot
- ·Students in all year groups have been reading material linked to sustainability during their tutor-time literacy sessions
- ·Tibshelf Eco Champions has been created a group of students who will meet up every two weeks, to discuss issues around sustainability and come up with ideas for events, competitions etc.
- ·Signed up to Zellar as a school and we have been working to build our school profile




Make sure your notifications are turned on!

Arbor- learn about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information. You can find all the details on your students' trips, attendance, and positive and negative marks through the Arbor app.

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App, or the Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, to safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

No Mobile Phones

If your student is to bring their mobile phone into school it **MUST** be switched off and put away in their bag.

Uniform and PE kit expectations

Students should arrive at school in full school uniform every day, including ties and blazers.

Please also be reminded of our uniform policy which stipulates that jeans/jeggings are not permitted, neither are trainers, hoodies, or face piercings, including clear/skin-colored retainers in the nose. Pupils will be required to remove such items.

We are required by Health and Safety guidance to keep rooms well-ventilated, this can make rooms colder than they would normally be, so we have taken some measures to mitigate against this.

No coats are to be worn in lessons.



Attendance and Illness at school



Reminder from our Attendance Officer

If we have not had communication regarding an absence before 8.30am this will be recorded on your child's Arbor as an unauthorised absence.

Students are required to be in tutor time for 8:30am, anyone not present will receive a late mark.

Illness at school

If your child is ill during the school day, they need to speak to their teacher and a First Aider/Medical Officer will be contacted. If they feel that they are too unwell to stay in school the first aider will contact parents/carers.

If your child is on medical evidence then the First Aider/Medical Officer will seek their Head of Years permission.

Students should NOT contact home without the permission of their Head of Year.










Reminder from our Medical Welfare Officer

If your child has any diagnosed medical conditions that the school needs to be aware of, please ensure a healthcare plan is completed annually and shared with our medical welfare officer, Mrs J Marshall. Any changes to their plan also needs to be updated with the school at the earliest opportunity.
